COMPLIANCE WITH HOUSE BILL 1295

In 2015, the Texas Legislature adopted House Bill 1295, which added section 2252.908 of the Government Code. The law states that a governmental entity may not enter into certain contracts with a business entity unless the business entity submits a disclosure of interested parties to the governmental entity at the time the business entity submits the signed contract to the governmental entity.

The law applies only to a contract of a governmental entity that either (1) requires an action or vote by the governing body of the entity or agency before the contract may be signed or (2) has a value of at least \$1 million. The disclosure requirement applies to a contract entered into on or after January 1, 2016.

The Texas Ethics Commission has adopted rules necessary to implement the law, prescribed the disclosure of interested parties form, and posted a copy of the form on the commission's website.

Filing Process:

The commission has made available on its website a new filing application that must be used to file Form 1295. A business entity must:

- 1) Use the application to enter the required information on Form 1295,
- 2) Print a copy of the completed form, which will include a certification of filing that will contain a unique certification number.
- 3) Contract Number should be the Bid/RFP Number and Bid Title.
- 4) Sign the printed copy of the form (an authorized agent of the business entity must sign),
- 5) Either include your personal information or have the form notarized,
- 6) File the completed Form 1295 with the certification of filing with the governmental body with which the business entity is entering into the contract.

The governmental entity must notify the commission, using the commission's filing application, of the receipt of the filed Form 1295 with the certification of filing not later than the 30th day after the date the contract binds all parties to the contract. The commission will post the completed Form 1295 to its website within seven business days after receiving notice from the governmental entity.



6.0 Work Plan

Following award of contract, our intention is to diligently work to provide all submittal requirements.

Then, we would move forward to procure materials that need to be fabricated such as the interior and exterior ladders, roof safety hand railings, aluminum roof hatch, etc., so they are ready when the crew arrives.

We will mobilize to the jobsite with our equipment trailers for containment, sandblasting, coating, dust collection, and dehumidification.

We will do as many steel modifications as possible before the blasting and coating begins such as removing existing ladders and ladder cages, installing new ladders, installing roof handrailing, removing roof vent, etc. Our plan is to reduce the amount of time that the reservoir needs to be out of service. However, several of the welding items and repairs are of course necessary after the reservoir is drained.

Then, we will build our TEPE containment system as well as get our rigging and equipment set up for the blasting and coating. During blasting and coating, we will use our 40,000cfm ECS Dust Collector for excellent dust collection and ventilation. For Dehumidification we will use our Stulz 5000cfm portable Dessicant Dehumidifier that is powered by a CAT 125kw Portable Generator. All blasting and coating will be done according to the specifications and applied with our experienced and professional applicators. Note: the final coat of exterior paint on the roof will be done after the containment apparatus is removed.

We plan to have rigging for both inside and outside set up at the same time and therefore have the ability to work in either location depending on the weather conditions, such as wind. However, our goal would be to focus on the interior wet to completion before finishing the outside coating, thus allowing for the proper cure time as per the safety/product data sheets.

We have noted that there are some trees in the area around the tank, and therefore plan to make every effort to minimize any disturbance to the trees in the area. If any branches are

obstructing our ability to install containment or perform the work properly, J.R. Stelzer Co. will discuss with the city and come to agreement before any tree or branches are removed.

After the blasting is complete, sampling of the spent abrasive will be done prior to any disposal. Testing will consist of composite samples analyzed for 8 RCRA metals by TCLP (Toxicity, Characteristic Leaching Procedure). With the inspection report showing levels of lead and on the existing coating, proper procedures will be taken. Recyclable steel grit, or a blastox additive to the sand blast media may be used in order to reduce the amount of potentially hazardous waste generated. Disposal of the spent abrasive will occur at a permitted landfill and will be hauled by trucks and trailers. All documentation will be submitted to the owner and engineer for approval, prior to disposal.

The property will be monitored and picked up daily for garbage and debris to ensure a clean work site throughout the project.

We will then finish any modifications that need to be done after the blast and paint, such as installing the new roof vent, aluminum roof hatch, safety climb systems, etc.

After the finish coat has reached the full cure time and is cleared for immersion, all rigging equipment will be removed. We then will work with the city to flush the stagnant water from the supply line and chlorinate the wet area as per specification. We will then secure, close all the hatches and the reservoir will be filled.

The reservoir could be put back into service at this point in the job.

After all installations affecting the reservoir is complete, we will demobilize and prepare for any site restoration that needs to occur. J. R. Stelzer Co. will leave the jobsite in as good or better condition than when we arrived.
