




Fossil Creek Mountain Bike Trails Complete— The Fossil Creek Mountain Bike Trails are essentially complete and being enjoyed by citizens and visitors. The only remaining items are the production of new trail rules and maps along with completion of the main kiosk. Shadow Trail Designs, the contractor specializes in natural surface hiking and biking trails with 16 years of relevant experience. In addition to a construction contract with Shadow Trail Designs, the City of North Richland Hills entered into an agreement with the Fort Worth Mountain Bikers Association as trail stewards. Their responsibilities to maintain the trail are typically carried out by volunteers on special workdays. Average Joes has been one of our most successful leagues since it's inception and we look forward to the continued momentum with future leagues. Also making its way back to the NRH Centre is Indoor CoEd Volleyball that takes place on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Both leagues are close to selling out as well with a total of 26 teams over the two nights.



Cultural Arts—The NRH Pop Up Gallery digital art exhibition “NRH Scenic Spot” went online Tuesday, May 11. 18 North Richland Hills area artists who have created images inspired by nature are represented in the show. Artwork covers a wide range of mediums, including sculpture, drawings, paintings, photography and digital art. Three images that were influenced by the recent Linda Spurlock Park renovations are featured in the virtual gallery, which will remain online through August. Interest appears to be high with 105 unique visitors to the NRHPopUpGallery website and 150 visits on the first day alone.
