



## CITY COUNCIL MEMORANDUM

**SUBJECT:** Approve Resolution No. 2026-026, appointing members to the Legislative Task Force of the City of North Richland Hills.

### **SUMMARY:**

At the March 23, 2026, City Council meeting, the City Council approved the establishment of the Intergovernmental and Legislative Affairs Program, including the creation of the Intergovernmental and Legislative Affairs Subcommittee of the City Council and the Legislative Task Force to be made up of 9 citizen volunteers recommended by the Mayor and appointed by the City Council. This memo presents the Mayor's recommended appointments for the nine resident members who will serve on the Legislative Task Force. Appointment of these members will complete the formation of the Legislative Task Force and allow it to begin its work in advance of the upcoming legislative cycle.

### **GENERAL DESCRIPTION:**

On March 23, 2026, the City Council approved the creation of the Intergovernmental and Legislative Affairs Program to strengthen the City's ability to monitor, evaluate, and respond to legislative developments at the state and federal levels. As part of this program, the City Council also established the Legislative Task Force, a resident-led advisory body responsible for evaluating the potential community impacts of proposed legislation and providing recommendations to help shape the City's legislative agenda.

The Legislative Task Force consists of nine North Richland Hills citizens who volunteer their time to support the City's legislative engagement efforts. In accordance with the structure approved by the City Council, members are recommended by the Mayor and appointed by the City Council. All members serve two-year terms beginning in May of the year prior to a regular session of the Texas Legislature. The inaugural terms will begin in May 2026 and conclude in April 2028.

The Mayor, with input from the City Council, has identified nine qualified residents whose backgrounds, community involvement, and expertise will support the mission and responsibilities of the Legislative Task Force. Appointment of these members will allow the group to organize, receive orientation, and begin reviewing legislative issues relevant to the community.
