

**NRH Park and Recreation Trail System Projects**—North Richland Hills Parks & Recreation received \$576,217 federal grant funding to make improvements to the city's trail system, including multiple crosswalk

improvements, sidewalk improvements, pavement markings and emergency location signage. There are a total of twelve sub-projects that encompass the full project. Most of the projects are nearing completion. One of the recently completed sub-projects included installation of 911 emergency location signage along all off-road trails. This sign type can be seen on numerous trails throughout the metroplex. In North Richland Hills, the green and white circle shaped signs are located every ¼ mile on all off-road trails. In the event trail users need emergency assistance, the trail user calling 911, can provide dispatch the trail location code listed on each sign. Each individual sign and unique code is listed in the overall city's 911 mapping system. With over 30-miles of hike and bike trails within NRH, this sign type provides trail users an additional level of communication when contacting 911 emergency services.



The full trail system improvements projects were selected based on the federal program criteria and available budget. The city will be reimbursed 80% of the costs of these improvements, up to \$576,217, by the Texas Department of Transportation with funding from the Federal Highway Administration's Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside Program.
